3) **The account of the Fall** which comes after the Creation account says things are getting worse due to man's sin. Is that true?

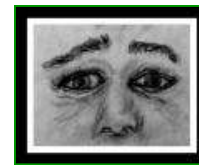

Problems with Evolution



1) **All theories of evolution contradict the Second Law of Thermodynamics.** This scientific law deals with "entropy", the law of "decreasing complexity". In other words, if you don't do anything to your lawn, it won't improve, it will deteriorate. The Harvard scientist, John Ross, has said: "There are no known violations of the second law of thermodynamics." This must include evolution. The theory actually defies science.



2) Sir Fred Hoyle, one of Britain's foremost scientists, a non-Christian, has declared that **the probability of an evolutionary origin of life is equal to the probability that a tornado, sweeping through a junkyard, would assemble a Boeing 747.**



3) **The "evidence" for evolution and prehistoric man is less than convincing.** They've never found a fossil of a missing link (half ape/half man). There's no proof of macroevolution happening in the past, in man, or in any creature. All examples of "missing links" like Lucy have been dismissed as hoaxes or skeletons with deformities.

Conclusion...

The problem with evolution is that it disregards God and the event of the fall of humans into sin, **it devalues human life**, regards death as natural and good, and it denies the need for a savior.

The explanation of creation by the Genesis account of 6-24 hour days, however, isn't as ridiculous as some modern day scientists claim.
